You make a report with an independent firm called NAVEX Global. HBIO Employee Relations Manager will assign it to the appropriate person and follow up to make sure it's being addressed.	Everyone. It's for all employees, regardless of location or position. The system is available in many languages, via both the telephone and internet.
